This month, I will share a bad experience I had. I was using a new (to me) brand name bowl gouge on some non-round wood. As I was trying to get the wood round, I had a kick back. My thumb was resting in the flute of the gouge and the kickback resulted in a nasty cut on my thumb. With further investigation, I found that the edges of the flute were very sharp. None of my other gouges were sharp, so I took a fine file to the edges and blunted the flute edge away from the cutting edge. Take a look at your gouges and check.
