
January: A goblet, wine glass, champagne flute etc. Any wood, any style, long thin stems not required.

Safety words that begin with "P"

Patience – You need patience to make progress. During this endeavor you may take two steps forward and one step backward. Patience needs to be developed. Therefore, patience requires practice.

Practice – Practice requires small consistent steps. It will improve your skills and progress. It is OK to make mistakes along the way. Small steps are better than no steps at all. If you are serious about turning then you want to be in it for the long haul.

Progress – You will see improvement in your skills. You will feel it. You know your confidence is building. Remember the saying – "practice makes perfect"? Don't believe it? How about "perfect practice makes perfect"? Well, don't try it. Perfection is not attainable. Just do your best and be happy with the results. Progress comes with perseverance.

Perseverance – There may be times when you just want to quit. Or you lose interest. Maybe life takes you in another direction. But if you are determined and focused on being successful then you may move forward, backward, side to side, and even tack at times. Nobody said the journey is a straight line. There will be challenges along the way. Perseverance is a character trait that you develop over time. Therefore, perseverance requires patience.

Perception – Perception consists of 5 keen senses: sight, sound, smell, taste, and touch. Perception is a brain process that allows creatures to take in sensory information from local surroundings. That information is assimilated to make sense for an appropriate response.

Protection – Protection comes in many forms. You have your PPE (Personal Protection Equipment), you have safety switches on your equipment, your natural ability, your situational awareness, your common sense. Can we do without these concepts? If you value your body, brain and health then think "NO".

Priority – Keep it close to you on your game table. Develop a routine of using your lathe or workshop. One successful priority builds upon the next.

Pigeonhole - Pigeonhole refers to a concept whereby you stay focused on the task at hand. As if you are in a tunnel only looking forward. To learn anything requires practice, but unguided practice may lead to hours or maybe years of slow ineffective learning. Whereas having a mentor to guide you can allow for the rapid improvement of your skills. After that you can go on to customize the basic skills to meet your own creativity.
