Have you turned Sycamore lately?

The American Sycamore (*Platanus Occidentalis*) easily grows throughout eastern and central U.S. It is a common landscaping tree across much of the east coast and is often planted by municipalities to shade streets and

parks. The American Sycamore has a few other names including buttonwood, water beech, American planetree, Western plane, and Occidental plane.

The American Sycamore

Sycamore's bark pattern makes it readily identifiable. The most striking feature of the tree is the bark that has a camouflage pattern comprised of gray-brown outer bark that peels off in patches to reveal the light gray or white wood beneath. The largest deciduous tree in the eastern united states, sycamore trees can grow 75 to 100 feet tall with a similar spread. The trunk may be as much as 10 feet in diameter.

Ohio's biggest recorded Sycamore

Sycamore is one of the softer hardwoods. In turning, it cuts easily, leaving a good surface off the tool with little tear out. The grain appearance is distinct and has an abundance of beautiful ray flecks, especially visible on quarter sawn surfaces. When turning a bowl, orientation of the form in the blank can accentuate the ray flecks. With a bit of luck, a deep bowl will exhibit flecks on two sides. A shallow piece may show flecks across its surface especially if the blank was quarter sawn.

Turning a sycamore bowl

Sycamore is a relatively light-weight wood with a specific gravity range of 24 to 37 lbs./ft³. While Oak can range between 37 to 56 lbs./ft³. Maple can range from 39 to 47 lbs./ft³. This feature is a great conversation piece when a sycamore bowl sits next to similarly sized bowl of oak or maple. The difference in weight can be distinguished easily.

When turning sycamore, it is best to turn it after it has seasoned. Thin wet sycamore pieces may crack, warp, and distort. Seasoned sycamore will sand easily and readily accepts a nice finish.

Sycamore is a strong wood with several uses. But as the tree ages, a fungus attacks and consumes the heartwood. The fungus does not kill the tree but makes it weak and hollow. Consequently, a large tree may contain no large turning blocks. Sycamore has little odor, nor any known

allergen or toxicity concerns.

Sycamore has many wood working uses such as bowls, platters, furniture, millwork, kitchen counters, cabinet cases, butcher blocks, toys, and as tone wood for stringed instruments. **HAVE YOU TURNED SYCAMORE LATELY?**

The hollow form is 4.5" dia by 10" high. Wall thickness 1/8 to 3/16". Body is elm burl; finial is African blackwood. Finish is Tung oil & hard wax.

Christmas ornament is about 9" high. Body is a 2.5" sea urchin shell reinforced with 3 coats of diluted Tight Bond II painted on inside. Finials are African blackwood. Finished with several coats of semi-gloss spray lacquer.

From Jeff Shumaker: OB Shine Juice

O.B.'s Shine Juice

By Capt. Eddie Castelin

Several years ago, I attended a demonstration where the turner was making a little bottle stopper project called the "hidden pill" stopper. He turned a piece of cocobolo and then sanded it using wax as a lubricant. I had not seen this method before and I had created some nice work with cocobolo and just did not get the right finish. I thought it was the secret to a great finish until he pulled out this little squeeze bottle of finish and proceeded to put a glass finish on it.

The turner was O.B. Lacoste of Lafayette and he soon became one of my mentors. The product he used was a mixture of shellac, boiled linseed oil and alcohol. We came to call this concoction "O.B.'s Shine Juice".

Ingredients:

3 ounces of plain, uncolored shellac. (Zinsser's Bulls Eye Shellac, Clear)

3 ounces of Boiled Linseed Oil. (Do not boil plain linseed oil)

3 ounces of Denatured Alcohol (do not use any other alcohol product)

I use a pint-sized mason jar for mixing and long-term storage of the materials.

Pour exact amounts into the Mason jar and mix thoroughly. Do not over agitate.

Pour a day's use into a small squeeze bottle (Harbor Freight # 94392-OVGA) for use.

Note: The alcohol will evaporate from open containers and the squeeze bottle. Return what you do not use to the mason jar for a pure finish.

To use:

With the lathe stopped, using a paper towel, rub in a good coat, covering all the surfaces of the piece. Rub it in well and wait a minute, repeat the process. Now, with the lathe running at 500-1000 RPM, add some finish to the paper towel and apply it slowly to the surface.

Keep the towel moving and the finish spreading. As the shellac adheres, the oil will begin to catalyze, and the alcohol will evaporate. All three steps are necessary for a good finish.

The coating will begin to build as you apply. At some point you will treat the finish as complete and stop adding material and polish the surface. If it begins to attract the towel or get gummy, stop lapping and allow it to set for a minute. Start again when it sets up. A coat of wax makes a finished product with great results.

As O.B. Lacoste put it one time, "If it was any easier, I'd have to come over to your house and do it for you."
