
## Pen Turning: The Write Way

A newcomer to woodturning stepped up to a lathe at our April meeting and turned her first pen after member Mike McInerney finished his demonstration for the Apple Valley Woodturners.

McInerney, of Centreville, is also a member and treasurer for the Capital Area Woodturners. His demonstration focused on a useful article, pens. McInerney took the members from selecting woods for pens, suppliers (Berea Hardwoods, is the company he prefers) and best sale outlets as well as how to actually turn pens. He discussed the items which marketed best in his experience too.

Because he works a full time job and has a large side business in specialty pens, McInerney has gone to an Towang Automatic Pen Lathe, on which he can produce 100 pens in an afternoon. However, he did his demonstration on a conventional lathe, using hand tools.

Pen blanks are readily available from wood craft suppliers, in a variety of woods. McInerney has some words of caution about drilling the blanks. He noted that the drill bit should be withdrawn frequently to clean the flutes, to avoid overheating the wood and causing it to fracture.

When installing the brass tube , he prefers to use an epoxy glue, instead of a cyanoacrylate (CA) glue. He feels the epoxy is more gap filling, than the CA glue.

He trims the glued up blank on a small disc sander to finish size.

McInerney discussed the various finishes you can use on the pens, including friction polishes and pen polishes.

He said he has some repeat customers who prefer a particular size pen.

Thicker ones seem to sell better than slim-line pens , he said . Slim-line pens have a cross refill, while the thicker ones use a roller ball refill for the most part. The roller ball is a higher quality refill, McInerney said.



Pencil mechanisms leave something to be desired, he said, because of alignment problems.


In addition to pens for writing, he also sells perfume pens , atomizers, and key rings. He also sells pen boxes, but these are provided as an addition to the pens, not as a set, so he actually makes two sales.

He markets his work at shows, craft fairs and to companies which are looking employee and client gifts around Christmas time.


## Show and Tell
