This month's raffle will include a Oneway Talon chuck. Keep those chips a flying and change your socks everyday.

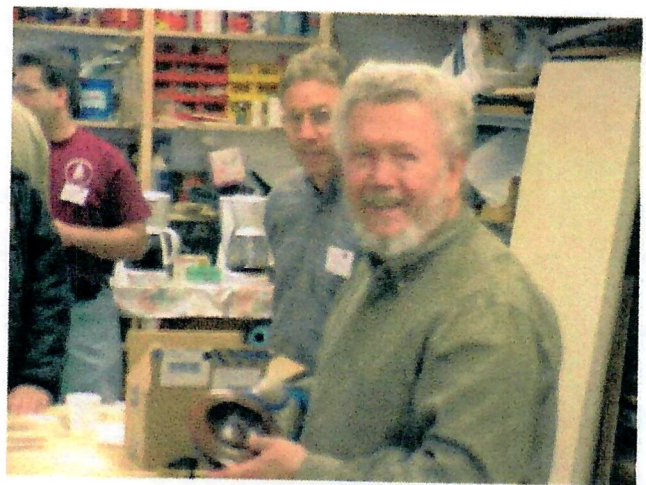
