


Apple Valley Woodturners

Banking on Banksia

The September meeting of the Apple Valley Woodturners featured a demonstration by AVW member Gene Gillespie on turning Banksia seedpods. Gillespie, a woodturner by profession, sells his work at numerous art galleries and craft shows in a multi-state area. Banksia is an Australian evergreen tree. The seedpod is so hard that the aborigines use it in place of coal. Because of that hardness, Gillespie recommends using a face shield while turning Banksia. He mostly uses a roughing gouge. He favors a brad point drill bit to open a hole in the pod, warning that it is difficult to get a hole in the true center, since the hardness of the material makes the bit wander. Despite the drawbacks hardness causes in turning, Banksia sands very easily. Gillespie said he likes to leave some of the fuzzy exterior of the seedpod on at his cost.



when sanding, to contrast with the seedpod material.

Gillespie likes the seedpods because their interesting shape sells well at craft fairs. Removing the many seeds and hollowing the center of the pod creates a great potpourri bowl.


He often slices the Banksia into disks and creates coasters.


Banksia pods come in a variety of sizes too.

Gillespie also makes weed pots from Banksia, but added that the glass tubes many people like to insert in them for flowers don't come in the same diameters as fractional or numbered drill bit sizes.

Gillespie rapidly turned three Banksia pods into weed pots.

A knowledgeable demonstrator, with a good sense of humor, he brought handouts on turning Banksia and a supply of pods which he offered to sell to members
